4 STEPHANIE: People listen to cell phones
5 and shit all the time, you know?

6 UNKNOWN MALE SPEAKER: People listen to
7 cell phones?

8 STEPHANIE: Yeah, they have like one of
9 those little cell phone scrambler things. You
10 can overhear cell phone conversations.

11 UNKNOWN MALE SPEAKER: What the heck? Is
12 that why you didn't want to call me?

13 STEPHANIE: Huh?

14 UNKNOWN MALE SPEAKER: Is that why you
15 didn't want to call me?

16 STEPHANIE: No. It's just that, I don't
17 know. I get paranoid about it. Those, you know,
18 people -- people look to take you down. People

8 things you have to take to the grave, you know?

13 STEPHANIE: They'd look at it as like a
14 perversion. I don't know. I'm like --

15 UNKNOWN MALE SPEAKER: That's the only
16 thing.

17 STEPHANIE: It's like a real old guy going
18 after really young girls, you know? It's creepy.
19 That's what they would see it as.

20 UNKNOWN MALE SPEAKER: Yeah, that's the
21 only thing that I was ever worried about was like
22 people spreading rumors and stuff.

23 STEPHANIE: Yeah, and the things is if you
24 don't, you know, if you don't say anything, you
25 know, not feel like the need to brag to your

1 friends or --

2 UNKNOWN MALE SPEAKER: No.

3 STEPHANIE: You know?

4 UNKNOWN MALE SPEAKER: Brag for what,

5 though?

6 STEPHANIE: Or you know, if -- what?

7 UNKNOWN MALE SPEAKER: What do you mean,
8 brag for what, though? It doesn't make sense.

9 STEPHANIE: No, okay. "Hey, I scored with
10 this person," you know, "Hey, I got," you know,
11 "I've slept with this many people."


